



Renzulli Learning, developed at the University of Connecticut, matches students' interests and learning styles to activities that provide enriched, challenging learning experiences. All activities are based on the **Enrichment Triad Model** which encourages creative productivity by exposing students to various topics, teaching them process-training skills, and providing opportunities to apply those skills through independent projects.

### Registration and Login

**Teachers & students:** must have Renzulli **district code** to register (ask your principal, librarian, lab aide or Lead Teacher for Inst. Tech.)

**Parents:** must have child(ren)'s Renzulli username and password.

Go to [www.renzullilearning.com](http://www.renzullilearning.com). Click the Students, Teachers, or Parents button (along bottom). To register, click **First Time Here?** or **New User** (on left under Links). Otherwise, type username /password.

**Edit Registration** (username/password): Click the **registration** link on the "home" screen (for teachers it's blue, in the upper right corner; for students it's in the tan bar below the dog). Click **Submit** to save.

**Mass Register Students:** Teachers may find it convenient to mass register young students. To avoid duplicate accounts, use the Add-Edit Students process (see **My Students** section) to check for student accounts before mass registering.

From the Teacher homepage, click **Register a student** in the EZ Path box. Click **Teacher Mode** and follow the prompts. Click **Next** to register another student. Click **Quit** after registering all students. The mass registration process assigns random usernames and passwords. To standardize student usernames consistent with SHENet accounts, refer to the **Username and Passwords** section under **My Students**.

### Individualized Profile



All students must complete a Talent Development Profile. Enrichment activities are customized based on the Profile.

From the top of the home screen, click **Renzulli Profiler**. The **EZ Reader** Profile can be used for all K-5 students (To change Profile formats, click **Change Your Profiler** in the upper right corner). Start with the first puzzle piece and answer all questions.

**Main:** Use the **Display** menu on the right to view the following types of information for each of your students.

- Student Summary
- Registration Info
- Profiles
- Questionnaires
- Enrichment Activities
- Sites Visited
- Self Assessments
- Open Ended Questions
- Projects/Assignments
- Notes and Uploads

**Manage Groups:** Create student groups so you can differentiate and share enrichment activities with groups of students based on ability, subject or interest area.

**Create Student Reports:** Identify which of students have similar profiles of interests, learning styles, and expression/product styles.

**Usernames & Passwords:** Teachers may change student usernames and passwords. Just click the **Edit** button next to a student name, make necessary changes and click **OK**.

**Add/Edit Students:** At the beginning of each school year (or any time), use the Add/Edit Students feature to specify which students are affiliated with you. Check or uncheck boxes to add or remove students. If desired, use the **Show** menu to filter students by grade and school. When finished, click the **Submit** button at the bottom.

**IMPORTANT:** Only "authorized" teachers may use this feature. If you do not have access to Add/Edit Students, contact your School Site Manager (library media specialists and computer lab aides are SSMs) and request your account be "authorized."

### Message Feature (Inbox)

When activities (web sites), assignments and projects are shared, they appear as a message in the Inbox.



Teachers can send messages to teachers or students, but students can only send messages to teachers (not to other students).

## Enrichment Activities

One of Renzulli's most powerful features is its safe and high quality search engine containing about 30,000 teacher-reviewed web sites and resources. After completing the Profile, users can access a personalized Enrichment Differentiation Database of resources unique to each student's interests, learning styles, and preferred modes of expression. Renzulli sorts activities and resources into 14 categories.



### Search Enrichment Activities:

Click **Activities Manager** in the blue menu bar, or the [Search Activities](#) button (upper right portion of the screen).



**Basic Search:** Search by keyword only.

**Advanced Search:** Narrow your search by specifying criteria such as enrichment type, interest area, grade and ability level.

**Search by State Standards:** [SEARCH BY STATE STANDARDS »](#)

Pick a core academic subject (Language Arts, Math, Science or Social Studies), grade level and specific standard (Science standards include only elementary process skills, not individual grade-level standards).

**Search as Student:** Select a student from the drop-down menu to search as if you were logged in as that student.

### Share Enrichment Activities with Students & Teachers

After viewing an enrichment activity, you may add it to your own "Favorites," share it with students and/or teachers, or attach it to an assignment or project. When activities are shared, the recipient receives a message in his/her Inbox.



## Assignments and Projects

Click **Lesson Planning & Differentiation** in the blue menu bar or click **Create a Student Assignment** in the **EZ Path** box (EZ Paths lead you through step-by-step instructions for several common tasks).

Renzulli defines assignments and projects as follows:

<b>Evaluation:</b>	Teacher provides criteria	Student Product Assessment Form (SPAF) available for teacher to use

Assignments and projects provide a scaffolded framework for teacher or student directed activities. Assignment **templates** and **Super Starter Projects** are available to use "as-is" or users may create their own assignments and projects from scratch.

## Portfolio

Click **My Portfolio** in the upper right corner to access the Portfolio (both teachers and students have a Portfolio). The Portfolio may contain favorite activities, projects and assignments, saved searches, notes, uploads and a record of sites visited. Teachers have the ability to view student assignments and projects through their own Portfolio.

## Teacher Resources

Click **Teacher Resources** in the blue menu. Many helpful resources are available, including online training videos and interactive tutorials.
