

Exit Poll 2016-17 Budget Vote Executive Summary

Survey participation was down this year with 19% of voters completing an exit poll. The actual vote was 81% yes to 29% no votes. The survey was 87% yes to 17% no votes.

Of those who responded to the exit survey, the majority:

- Voted yes (87%)
- Felt maintaining a quality education was the most important factor in determining their vote (91%).
- Voted yes on the Capital Project (84%), Capital Reserve Fund (85%) and the Bus Referendum (84%).
- Rate the quality of education at Shenendehowa as excellent (61%). This number has increased consistently over the past six years (50% in 2011).
- Feel that the board and administration are leading the district in the right direction with 40% saying yes (the highest in six years) and 42% saying most of the time.
- Think that the district's taxes are reasonable (75%). This has consistently increased over the past six years (58% in 2011).
- Are willing to pay more than the maximum allowable tax levy in order to avoid cuts to the current programs (69%) up from 58% in 2011.
- Places the most importance on preserving a highly qualified staff (95%). The ranking of priorities has changed over the years but highly qualified staff and rigorous and relevant curriculum (88%) have stayed the top priorities.
- Get their information from the district's newsletter (81%). Use of the district's social media sites continues to increase.
- Feels that the district's communications provides them with good, sound information (69%).
- Live in Clifton Park (69%)
- Are between the ages of 31-50 (47%).
- Have children in Shenendehowa Schools (53%).
- Have children in grades K-5 at Shen (54%).
- Are not employed by the district (85%).

How did you vote on the propositions?

Should be included with budget and use the property we have on the campus for a new school.

I work for SCSD so I know the importance / value of passing the school budget (both short-term and long-term impact).

I feel the school system should fund these as we go. Having a bank surplus leads to wasteful spending.

It seems every year we are voting on buying more buses. As I drive my child to school each day I seem more than half the buses sitting in the bus garage area. I think we have enough buses

You have sought funds for these same projects repeatedly - they never seem to get completed, and yet you found money to waste on men and huge earth-moving equipment to "level" an already flat field, and fence it in, for seemingly no purpose at all save to deprive the kids of open space. Even the workers mocked this as "your tax dollars at work." Meanwhile, bright kids are pretty openly mocked and discouraged by teachers and principals, while needy students are ignored and IEPs refused. The district needs a new attitude, not more funds. Education "quality" is sacrificed whether there's money for "capital improvements" or not. Please show the discipline and frugality that most of us show in our household budgets and then I can consider additional funding. I will not consider paying more that the amount allowed under the tax levy limit cap and believe paying more is not necessary to maintain the quality of education.
