DID YOU KNOW? The size of this Early Learning Center will be equivalent to almost two elementary schools combined! This building is a major asset and game changer.

ABOUT:

5 Maxwell Drive, a property donated to the district by Don and Beverly Greene & Family, is a 150,000 sq. ft. building, of which 110,000 sq. ft. will be completely gutted in accordance with New York State Education Department facilities/building standards in order to become an early learning center. The Maxwell Drive facility answers the district's need for space to accommodate full-day Kindergarten, having the capacity to accommodate over 700 children. Additionally, portions of the building will house alternative education programs and allow for the centralization of district operations.

OBJECTIVES OF THE PROJECT:

- Provide upwards of 42 classrooms for kindergarten and potentially pre-K purposes.
- Free up **24** additional classrooms between the eight elementary schools, reducing congestion and allowing for future growth.
- Potentially frees up spaces in the Middle School and High School East and West, for classroom purposes.
- Expand capacity for alternative education programming, from tutoring to special education, to college collaborations.
- Consolidate various district operations and warehouse storage.

PROPOSED REFERENDUM AMOUNT FOR THIS PROJECT NOT TO EXCEED \$55M

Cost to build 42 new classrooms from scratch, estimated at \$93M+ Cost to build 42 classrooms at 5 Maxwell, estimated at \$55M+ Cost Savings Due to Donation: Approx. \$38M+

HOW MUCH WILL IT COST TAXPAYERS AND HOW WILL WE MITIGATE THE IMPACT?

ESTIMATED TAX IMPACT

Less than 25 cents (\$0.25) per 1,000 taxable assessed value.



Approximately \$25M of funds borrowed to be reimbursed by State Building Aid.



Use of Capital Project Reserves of \$3M to offset amount to be borrowed.



30 year bonding spread allows for smoothing of debt payments, first full payment in 2026.



ECONOMIES OF SCALE WHAT ARE THE ADDITIONAL ADVANTAGES?

- Minimize or eliminate certain recurring operational costs (ex: warehouse lease expenses - \$135K/year).
- Potential Kindergarten transition aid to offset operating costs for initial years.
- Potential use of state funding for Universal Pre-K to support operations of applicable classes.
- Potential proceeds from the sale of the existing District Office.

2023-24 School Budget

Proposed Budget: \$206,611,477

- Preserves school programs and services, provides for key enhancements, and keeps the tax implications to a minimum.
- Yields a tax levy below the Tax Cap and maintains a relatively flat impact on local taxpayers.
- Positions the district to effectively leverage federal dollars and avoid a funding cliff beyond 2024.
